### 1. Webinar

#### 6. Mock MUN Session

The session simulated the United Nations Security Council (UNSC), focusing on "Strengthening International Legal Frameworks to Combat Terrorism." With 28 delegations, including Hindi and English debaters, discussions commenced with a General Speakers List, followed by a lively session lasting over two hours. The session transitioned seamlessly into a Moderated Caucus, a pivotal segment of MUNs, which delved into potential solutions for countering terrorism. This segment proved to be the highlight of the conference, as delegates engaged in debates, exchanged innovative ideas, and worked collaboratively towards formulating effective strategies. Time constraints prevented a Draft Resolution but prompted an Unmoderated Caucus. At the end of the event, accolades were bestowed upon standout participants for their exemplary contributions. Anjali Pandey (South Korea) secured 'Best Delegate,' Nandini Dang (USA) 'Best Speaker,' with 'Honorable Mentions' for Vidhi Pathak (Japan) and Anamika Chatterjee (France). Engaging discussions empowered newcomers, infusing renewed enthusiasm among the participants.



#### 7. An Induction at the Freshers'
